

## **GET YOUR GENEALOGY/FAMILY TREE DONE FOR FREE**

The Metis Settlements are Metis communities who own and govern their own land base. Metis people who are descendants of Metis ancestors and who are currently members of a contemporary Metis community have Metis aboriginal rights. However, due to recent Supreme Court of Canada rulings, the Government of Canada and Provincial Governments may require Metis organizations to substantiate or show evidence that we represent rights-bearing Metis. This is why it is very important for our Settlement members to have their family trees completed. This genealogical evidence is needed to back up our claims to the government, and to the world, that we are Metis rights-bearing communities.

## WHY IS THE GENEALOGY REPORT IMPORTANT?

This genealogical evidence is crucial to substantiate our Metis rights, especially in discussions and negotiations on aboriginal rights under Section 35 of the Constitution of Canada. It also helps in maintaining sustainable and responsible harvesting practices by ensuring future generations can continue to harvest.
